COBDEN FLOORS AND FURNISHINGS

Established on Friday 13th February 1953 by George Crawford, this business has proved a good luck story with ownership taken up by Geoffrey and Gwenyth Steele in 1975 and, subsequently, by their children, Susan and Jonathan, in 2001.

After more than 60 years of catering for the needs of Cobden, Heytesbury Settlement and Corangamite Shire residents and businesses, Cobden Floors and Furnishings continues to be an important and respected member of the town's business community. Certainly, not just 'part of the furniture' but an institution in its own right!

The business is acclaimed for its floor sanding and polishing, its carpets, vinyls, floating floors, blinds, bedding and furniture.

Ten things you may not know about Cobden Floors and Furnishings and the people behind the business:

- Known in 1953 as Crawford Furniture, the business 1. was situated in the well-known market opposite Cobden Kitchens and Joinery (which was the Cobden Theatre at the time).
- 2. George Crawford built the present shop in the 1960s.
- 3. The west side of the building belonged to Frank Northeast who conducted a very traditional gentleman's hair salon and pool hall. The undercover stand at the Cobden Recreation Reserve is named after Mr Northeast, a champion sportsman.
- 4. Geoffrey and Gwenyth Steele purchased the hair salon/ pool hall area in the 1980s to house new carpet-cutting equipment.
- 5. Crawford Furniture also had shops in Camperdown and Timboon for many years before consolidating them in Cobden.
- 6. Employees who have worked in the business over the years have included Jim Creece, David Smith, Alan Clementson, Trevor Nelson, Bill Taylor, John Rix, Philip Smith, Neal Simmonds, Jamie Alexander, Sandra Cobbledick and Sam Rix (as a floor covering contractor).
- 7. Gwenyth Steele came to Cobden from Melbourne and worked as a registered nurse at Cobden Bush Nursing Hospital before joining husband Geoffrey in the business.
- 8. Susan Shepherd began working in the shop after completing an Arts degree at Ballarat College of Advanced Education (now Federation University). Husband Rodney is a keen fisherman who writes a fishing column for local papers, articles for fishing publications including online blogs as well as working in the business as a flooring contractor.
- Jon Steele attended Cobden Technical School before 9. completing a fitting and turning apprenticeship at Ford in Geelong between 1987 and 1991. A ten-year member of Cobden Apex who served one term as president, Jon was also on the Cobden Football Netball Club committee for eight years, three of them as secretary. He has been a Cobden Sports Club vice-president too.
- Cobden is almost certainly the smallest town in Victoria 10. with a dedicated carpet and furniture business.
