2 FOR ACTION (from previous meeting, correspondence and reports)

A. Tiny Towns grants program. This RDV program is for community infrastructure projects in towns with a population up to 5000 people. Grants between \$5000 and \$50,000 were available with applicants making a co-contribution to the project. Applications closed on 25 February 2024. Last meeting's resolution to investigate applying for a Tiny Town grant to produce a significant mural with a Cobden historical theme had to be modified with insufficient time available to get a design and mural artist organised. It was decided to still apply for funding – only using historical photographs under the 'Welcome to the Cobden Story' theme. The deadline was met with eight minutes to spare.

B. Cobden community projects

C Christmas on Apex (2023 Committee)

ACTION: When the full financial result of Christmas-on-Apex 2023 is known (if a reasonable profit is forthcoming), a committee will be sought to embark on work on celebrating Cobden's festive season.

D Lake Cobden (Committee)

It was decided the resolution passed at the February meeting needed more consideration. A positive response from GreenCon was received and Barb Cowley had an opportunity to discuss the lake with the Heytesbury District Landcare Network. However it was decided the first step should be to contact

the Corangamire Shire with whom we already have a MoU about the lake's maintenance. A meeting with the Acting Director Works and Services Jarrod Woff has been arranged for Tuesday 5th February at 1.15pm. Interested people welcome.

E Free Camp (Reference Group)

ACTION: Cr Jo Beard wrote to PC explaining she has the Shire's works department scoping up the task of sealing Bond St through to Grayland St – and that she will work further on a business case to put up a budget bid. A request from Progressing Cobden for the sealing of Bond St to be considered was suggested.


